Prohibited and Restricted Commodities - Overview

Before you list your commodity, you need to find out if your commodity is allowed on AgriWorld Exchange and if the type of commodity is subject to certain restrictions to avoid potential issues with your listing. As an AgriWorld Exchange seller, you are ultimately responsible for making sure that selling a commodity is legal in the eyes of the law.

Violations of these policies may result in a range of actions, including:

- Listing cancellation
- Limits on account privileges
- Account suspension
- Forfeit of AgriWorld Exchange fees on cancelled listings

When policy violations occur, AgriWorld Exchange emails the seller, as well as bidders, that a listing has been ended. You may contact AgriWorld Exchange to report violations by using the "Report" or "Contact Us" links found on most policy pages.

Understanding the rules about prohibited and restricted commodities

- Policies about listing commodities are often based on country and state laws. However, many restrictions may involve the sale of dangerous or sensitive commodities and are not necessarily prohibited by law. The limitations are the result of input by numerous stakeholders, including the Community.
- When selling across borders, be aware of <u>international trading</u> and <u>import restrictions</u>. Certain commodities may be legal in your country, but may be illegal elsewhere.
- Just because a particular type of commodity is listed below, it does not mean that it is completely prohibited.
- It is also important to review the <u>Rules for Listings</u> and the <u>Rules about Intellectual</u> <u>Property</u> to check if your type of commodity has additional restrictions that would affect your listing.
